1. BACKGROUND

This document is the last deliverable of the EUMSSI project foreseen by the Description of Work:

Public Showcase: Web enabled (or DVD based) public Showcase featuring a meaningful subset (software, data, etc.) of the functionality characterising the project demonstrator(s) arrived at, along with relevant copyright notices and contact information, and suitable installation aids and run-time interfaces. The European Commission is granted the right to use the Showcase for its own dissemination and awareness activities (including Web based and electronic publications) after the completion of the project.

It basically describes how to access the public showcase, consisting of the two demonstrators developed in the course of the project, and gives a description of the terms of use.



2. INTRODUCTION

As a result of the work in this project, two demonstrators have been built, one for each of the two use-cases envisaged by the Document of Work. Both demonstrators, the Storytelling tool and the Second-screen, are hosted in the same environment. Section 3 describes that environment.

Section 4 is dedicated to the Storytelling (aka Contextualising) tool, and section 5 is dedicated to the Second-screen tool.

The terms of use can be found in section 6, and the Contact details in Section 7.

3. SHOWCASE ENVIRONMENT

The public showcase is hosted in a dedicated server placed in a third-party Data Center in Barcelona. The cost of this server is assumed by VSN.

The server is a physical machine (i.e. not a virtual machine) with the following specifications:

- Intel Xeon CPU E5504 @2GHz 64 bits
- 62 GB RAM
- 1 TB disk capacity in RAID
- Ubuntu 15.04 OS

The Data Center guarantees a 24 hours a day, 365 days a year level of service, which means that it should be available all the time. The bandwidth of the Data Center is 20 MB, which should be more than enough for demonstration purposes.

After the Final review meeting, the data will be frozen, i.e. the crawlers will be stopped and no new data will be added to the demonstrators, but all the functionality will be available with the stored data.

The whole consortium will keep their credentials to access the server in case they want to modify or improve on the code.

All the members of the consortium will have the possibility to use the platform for their own promotion or to use it for other research projects while the platform is alive.

The European Commission will be able to use the Showcase for its own dissemination and awareness activities after the completion of the project.

The service will be up and running at least until January the 1st, 2018. Beyond that date, VSN will evaluate the use of the platform (internal and external) to decide if it will be maintained for another year.



4. STORYTELLING TOOL

The Storytelling (aka Contextualising) tool can be accessed from any browser, although the use of Google Chrome is highly recommended. The URL of the site is:

No credentials are required to start using the demonstrator. All the functionalities are available directly to the user.

A full, and very detailed explanation of this demonstrator can be found in deliverable [D6.4 "Final version of Contextualising tool"](#), which is openly accessible from the EUMSSI website, where the link to the demonstrator can be found as well.



5. SECOND-SCREEN TOOL

The second-screen tool requires two different URLs in order to use it, one for each browser or device required in the demo: one for the main screen and another one for the second screen.

It is recommended for a fullest user experience to use a tablet or mobile phone to show the second screen. However, a second browser window can be used as well.

In order to “connect” both applications, the same user name must be used in both sites, although any user name will be valid. No passwords are required.

6. TERMS OF USE

The European Commission, as well as the members of the consortium, are granted the right to use the Showcase for their own dissemination and awareness activities (including Web based and electronic publications).

The only constraint is related to the content provided by Deutsche Welle. The following text is extracted from the DOW. Deutsche Welle have expressed that this text should not suffer any modification:

Deutsche Welle informs the parties that much of the background and side ground (e.g. video, audio, text, images, animations and the like) supplied by Deutsche Welle to the EUMSSI parties has third party rights attached thereto and needs to comply with respective rules and regulations regarding its re-use. Regarding the content supplied to the EUMSSI parties by Deutsche Welle, be it content that has third party rights attached thereto or be it content to which DW holds the rights - all here referred to collectively as "content" -the following applies:

- *Content that is supplied to the parties by DW may be used by the parties and their affiliates for the execution of the project only, as described in the description of work. The content supplied by Deutsche Welle may not be transferred to entities outside the consortium, and may not be used for non-EUMSSI purposes without the explicit approval in writing of Deutsche Welle.*
- *For the avoidance of doubt and to give some examples: it is not allowed to use the content supplied by Deutsche Welle for commercial purposes besides those that are for the execution of the project; license or sub-license it; sell or re-distribute it; include it on websites or portals other than those directly involved with the EUMSSI project; screen / place / display it on media platforms such as TV, mobile devices, radio etc. without the explicit approval in writing of Deutsche Welle.*
